TOTAL Number Impacted with United Way Support **69,771**

TOTAL Number served in Fairfield County **2,045**

Number of People Served through Education, Jobs and Life Skills Programs **251**

Through Education, Jobs and Life Skills programs youth had the opportunity to improve the cognitive, social and physical well being of youth so they are better prepared to complete high school and achieve self-sufficiency. Adults had the opportunity to gain knowledge and skills necessary for self-sufficiency and thus employment opportunities that produces an annual salary above the poverty level.

Number of People Served through Families, Individuals and Children Programs **38**

Through Families, Individuals and Children programs, people were able to obtain counseling and other services to address their individual and family needs. Parents were able improve their parenting skills and reduce the threat of abuse or neglect.

Number of People Served through Food, Shelter, Safety and Transportation Programs **1,078**

Through Food, Shelter, Safety and Transportation programs, Fairfield County residents increased their access to food pantries and reduced their food insecurity. They also had their immediate needs met following crises like fires.

Total Number of People Served through Health and Recovery Programs **678**

Through Health and Recovery programs, residents improved their health and safety skills. Youth and their families had the opportunity to learn healthy ways of eating, and strategies to reduce obesity. People with dual diagnoses of mental illness and substance abuse were targeted for intensive services that enhance recovery.

Using 2006 results, Fairfield County residents represented 3% of Midlands residents impacted by United Way-supported programs. The service represented \$231,211 of United Way Community Impact resources.
